## WHO IS THE DATA CONTROLLER?

## THE PURPOSE AND LEGAL BASIS FOR THE USE OF THE DATA?

We would like to kindly inform you that the data will be used to make your personal data public on the basis of your voluntarily given consent (Article 6(1)(a) RODO - consent, Article 81 of the Act of 4 February 1994 on Copyright and Related Rights). Please be assured that you may revoke your consent at any time.

In the case of images that are only a detail of the whole (such as group photos, photos or recordings of parties, or photos or recordings where the image of a person is not the main or basic element of the shot), we would like to kindly draw your attention to the fact that no consent is required in accordance with Article 81, paragraph 2, point 2 of the Act of 4 February 1994 on Copyright and Related Rights.

We would like to kindly inform you that your data will not be used for decision-making based solely on automated processing of personal data, including profiling within the meaning of Article 22 of the DPA.

## HOW LONG WE WILL BE USING YOUR DATA FOR?

We would like to kindly inform you that your personal data will be used for as long as it is made public or until any withdrawal of consent.

# HOW TO WITHDRAW YOUR CONSENT TO THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA?

You have the right to withdraw your consent to the processing of your personal data at any time. If you exercise this right - we will stop processing such data and it will be deleted. The withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of the use of the data during the period when the consent was in force.

# WHAT RIGHTS DO YOU HAVE?
