

Scientific Information Network: The SGGW Main Library and the Institute Librariese

The SGGW Main Library is located near the dormitories in a quiet part of the campus. The Main Library and the Institutes' libraries form the SGGW Scientific Information Network (NSI). When you are in the Main Library, you can stay in Reading Room A (silent zone), Reading Room C (for group work), the 4Team Room (for groups of up to 12 people), and the acoustic booths (for groups of up to four people). In addition to the printed collections, you can use digital resources in the article and e-book databases outside campus by logging into your student account. Once activated, Your Student ID card can be used to borrow books and other materials and use online resources. You can also pick up books ordered online at the 24/7 book locker, next to the drop box where you can return borrowed books.

The EDUROAM Wi-Fi network is accessible throughout the entire facility. Our NSI experts offer assistance in using the resources and space effectively.



Student Mobility

Student exchange programmes: the Erasmus+ programme, the CEEPUS programme, and the bilateral exchange programme offer the opportunity to study abroad at over 200 universities in the EU and non-EU countries. Traineeships and internships in foreign institutions, companies and non-profit organisations allow students to gain work experience and put their acquired knowledge into practice.



The **SGGW** Erasmus Student Network welcomes international students to the SGGW academic community, making sure that every incoming student is supported and may easily engage in the SGGW academic community.


